

GENERAL CARE

With thoughtful care, our upholstered furnishings will last for many years. To ensure durability, lasting comfort, and enduring beauty, follow these guidelines to protect the fabric, filling, frame, and finish of your furniture:



Keep sharp objects away from upholstery.



Keep furniture clear from chemicals and harsh cleaners to avoid discoloration and damage to the fabric, leather, wood, or metal.



To avoid stiffening or depigmentation, place furniture at least 16 inches away from sources of heat or cold.



Avoid prolonged exposure to dampness or wetness.



Avoid constant direct sunlight to prevent fading or discoloration.

Vacuuming with a soft brush attachment also is recommended to remove any dust and debris that may accumulate in crevices, around buttons, in the welting or underneath cushions.

If a liquid or other substance leaves a stain or water mark, we recommend contacting a professional cleaning service. Never use cleaning solutions on your leather furniture.





Leather is one of the most durable upholstery materials. However, leather still needs regular care and cleaning to maintain its natural beauty and extend the product life.

For minor liquid stains, quickly soak up the spill by carefully blotting up the liquid with a clean white cloth. Let the area air dry. Most spills are blotted up and dry very easily.

If a liquid or other substance leaves a stain or water mark, we recommend contacting a professional cleaning service. Never use cleaning solutions on your leather furniture.



FABRIC CARE

The **cleaning code** is comprised of the cleaning instructions for furniture covers. It's a guideline to teach people how to address **"spot stains"** with the right cleaner.

ot clean only with water-based shampoo or foam
nolstery cleaner. etest a small, inconspicuous area before proceeding. not over wet. Do not use solvents to spot clean. e fabrics may require brushing with a non-metallic, soft stle brush to restore appearance or reset nap. shion covers should not be removed and laundered.
ot clean only with a water-free dry-cleaning solvent. etest a small, inconspicuous area before proceeding. not saturate. Do not use water. e fabrics may require brushing with a non-metallic, soft stle brush to restore appearance. shion covers should not be removed and dry-cleaned.
ot clean with upholstery shampoo or dry-cleaning vent designed for furniture. Pretest a small, onspicuous area before proceeding. not saturate. e fabrics may require brushing with a non-metallic, soft stle brush to restore appearance. t water extraction or steam cleaning is not a commended cleaning method. shion casings should not be removed and laundered or -cleaned.
ean only by vacuuming or light brushing with a non- tallic, soft bristle brush. not use any water or solvent based cleaner.
